**Topic:** **The Katy Perry Case**  
With media attention on an Australian owner of a registered trade mark for “Katie Perry” for “clothes” and well-known musical artist Katy Perry as an alleged infringer through branded concert and other merchandise, the Katy Perry case has been high profile. The case having been heard on liability and judgment reserved by Justice Markovic in the Federal Court, now is a great time to learn more about trade mark law by considering the issues in the case.

Hear from Odette Gourley, one of our leading IP lawyers, who acted for Katy Perry about the fascinating trade mark law issues raised by the case including:

- the application of the “own name” trade mark infringement defence to professional artists;
- the content of the “good faith” component of the defence and what we learn from the historical origins of the defence;
- with the registered mark for “clothes”, the arguments in relation to footwear and the proviso for use in relation to “goods of the same description”;
- depending on factual findings still to be made, issues that might arise on the exercise of discretion on Katy Perry’s revocation cross-claims; and
- whether a brand owner licensor exercising quality control over use by licensees and retailers is a joint tortfeasor.

The Court’s decision is likely to shed light on these and other complex Australian trade mark law issues, and this introduction to the case will provide helpful insights for those who will be studying the reasons in due course.
